Meeting Minutes March 5, 2020

Selectmen present: Allen Belouin, Rebecca Mitchell, William Whisman – via teleconference **Other in attendance**: Diane Kendall, Interim Town Administrator; Tom Cavanaugh, Police Captain; Dan Gorman, Fire Chief; Cynthia Gidley, Ambulance Lieutenant; See Sign-In Sheet

Mr. Belouin called the meeting to order at 7:00pm

Mr. Belouin motioned to accept the public of February 18th, seconded by Mr. Whisman and unanimously approved.

New Business:

Full Time Police Officer Appointment: Town Clerk Carol Baker and Selectmen Chair Allen Belouin administered the Oath of Office for Police Officer Tyler Davy for the position of full-time Police Officer, with an effective date of March 1, 2020. Captain Cavanaugh and several members of the Hillsboro Police Department were present to support and congratulate Officer Davy. Officer Davy will continue his training and enter the next available full-time police academy. Selectmen approved a rate adjustment for Mr. Davy from \$16.53/per hour to \$17.02/per hour.

Per-Diem Ambulance Appointments: Fire and Ambulance Chief Dan Gorman and Lt. Cynthia Gidley introduced two of five department candidates: Amy Kendall, Advanced EMT and Dakota Poole, EMT. Mr. Belouin motioned to approve candidate appointments:

Ms. Mitchell seconded and the motion passed unanimously. Selectmen congratulated and thanked the new employees.

Town Meeting Preparation: Selectmen met with Town Moderator Phil Bryce to prepare for Town Meeting on March 14th.

Unanticipated Revenue: Mr. Belouin motioned to accept unanticipated revenue of \$3,000 to revenue account 01.3504.33.330 Code Enforcement Penalty and to appropriate the funds to function Public Safety account 01.4299.33.330 for the enforcement relative to State of NH Judicial Branch Notice of Decision State v. Fortier and Agreement dated February 18, 2020. Ms. Kendall and Code Enforcement Officer Mr. Borden will keep Selectmen apprised of next steps to include an RFP for safe cleanup of the property and continued monitoring and enforcement.

Continued Business:

Police Chief Recruitment: Interviews have been scheduled for April 3 and April 10th. The interview panel includes the Selectmen; Scott Lester, Antrim Police Chief; Michael Beausoleil Esq., Town Prosecutor; and Russell McAllister, Town Administrator.

Town Hall Parking Lot: Ms. Kendall relayed information from Road Agent Brian Houghton. Advanced Paving inspected the damaged parking lot paving on Monday March 2. The cause of the damage is still unknown. Mr. Houghton has the crew removing and filling the damaged sections with gravel to level and improve safety. Investigation into the cause undermining the pavement will ensue this spring. Once mitigated, Mr. Houghton assures the board Advanced Paving guarantees service to repave the damaged sections of the lot.

Chimney Bid: Selectmen tabled decision on Chimney Bid award pending more information from the vendors and Building Inspector Mike Borden.

Selectmen tabled approval of Yield Tax Timber for Map 217 Lot 007 until a full quorum of board is physically present.

Mr. Belouin and Ms. Mitchell entered non-public session at 8:00pm. The Selectmen returned to public session at 8:20pm. Mr. Belouin motioned to seal the minutes, seconded by Ms. Mitchell, because it was determined that divulgence of this information likely would affect adversely the reputation of any person other than a member of this board and render a proposed action ineffective. Roll call vote: Mr. Mitchell, aye; Mr. Belouin, aye. The motion passed; the minutes will be sealed.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Beloin made the motion to adjourn seconded by Ms. Mitchell and unanimously approved. The meeting adjourned at 8:25pm

NEWS:

- 1. DPD has a pending personnel issue.
- Cpt. Cavanaugh and Admin Assistant Whisman attended the budget meeting on February 6th.
- 3. Officer Davy is moving from part-time to a full-time officer. He will be sworn in at the Town Meeting and will attend the full-time academy in either April or September.
- 4. Four quotes were sent out this month requesting quotes for the 2014-2020 cruiser upfit.
- 5. Adamson Industries came and took measurement of the 2014 cruiser equipment to see what could be re-used for the 2020 cruiser.

TRAINING:

1. Officer Tyler Davy is continuing to do very well with his Field Training with Cpt. Cavanaugh at Deering and with Ofc. Parsons and Ofc. Hodgen from Hillsborough. He will complete his FTO in March.

GRANTS:

- 1. Crimeline grant is now available for 2020. The grant is in the process of being written and reviewed. We are requesting an additional RADAR Speed Sign to be placed in the town to help enforce traffic speeds.
- 2020 Office of Highway Safety Mobilization Patrols We have started working these patrols. These will be worked as overtime shifts (for FT Officers) or as extra straight time shifts (for PT Officers) during specific campaign time periods from October 2019 through Sept 2020.
- 3. We are still waiting to hear on approvals of a NH Statewide Radio Reprogramming Inclusion grant project through NH Homeland Security/Grants Management Unit.

- 1. Allegation of sexual assault-boyfriend assaulted girlfriend-joint investigation with HPD-still pending
- 2. Possible sexual assault involving 10 y/o females. CAC has an interview tentatively on the 31 Jan 2020 with the suspect-still pending








