Subject: Monthly Report

This month's report will cover the period from 1 December to 31 December 2011. The Deering Fire and Rescue responded to 21 calls during the month. Our total call volume for 2011 was 225; 153 EMS and 72 Fire related responses.

Ambulance One went out of service on December 24th. Because of the Holidays and having to wait for parts, the Town Highway Mechanic was unable to put the vehicle back in service until the 29th. All other apparatus remained in service.

Captain Joe Bulcock coordinated a seven day long work detail at the Donovan Station involving inmates from the Hillsborough County House of Correction. As part of a work release program, inmates from HCOC painted the interior of the apparatus bay and the kitchen during this period. The only cost to the town was for materials and lunch for the inmates. This is the first time the interior of the Donovan Station has been completely painted since 1991. Captain Bulcock was assisted by Lieutenant Pat Murdough, who was also instrumental in coordinating the work of Hill Top Heating who performed the plumbing installation for our new gear dryer.

The new turnout gear was picked up by Assistant Chief Ladue and distributed to the members on December 6th.

There was no Fire or EMS training for the month due to the Holidays.

A crew of helpers on Engine One delivered Santa Claus to the Town Hall as scheduled on December 10th for our annual Town Christmas celebration. It continues to be our honor to transport this important dignitary to our festivities during his busiest time of year!
