Subject: Monthly Report

This month's report will cover the period from 1 January to 31 January 2012. The Deering Fire and Rescue responded to 21 calls during the month.

Engine Three was out of service for a brief time on the 17<sup>th</sup> due to a problem with one of the batteries. Captain Bulcock was able to perform a field repair on the apparatus that same evening and a new battery was installed by the Highway Mechanic the following day.

The furnace at the Donovan Station also needed repairs during the same time period which was taken care of by Hill Top Heating.

The electrical work has been completed on our gear washer and dryer; our thanks to Doug Lalmond for performing this work for us.

On January 5<sup>th</sup>, Firefighter Corey Porter began a FFI certification class hosted by the Jaffrey Fire Department. Firefighter/EMT Tony Mayfield became a CPR instructor through the Emergency Care & Safety Institute on January 20<sup>th</sup>. Deputy Chief Jim Tramontozzi successfully completed the ICS 300 program in Henniker over four evenings during the month.

Department Fire and EMS training for the month was combined over two dates covering two annual training events. CPR recertification took place on January 24<sup>th</sup> and Blood Borne Pathogens training was held on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

We attended additional training on the 31<sup>st</sup> with members of the Hillsboro, Henniker, and Antrim Fire Departments. Representatives from Osram/Sylvania gave a presentation on their Incident Response Plan and gave us a tour of their facility.

My thanks to the Board of Selectmen for their support in adopting our updated Rules and Regulations at the Public Hearing held on January 18<sup>th</sup>.
