NEWS:

We have one license of our new Crimestar Records Management System in place, and have conducted training on this. As expected, there is some 1. discomfort with the troops over this dramatic change. Our grant, as written was denied for the reason that Highway Safety will cover "new" records systems, but not replace them. I will be reapplying for funds to cover our second necessary license as an "upgrade" in services to our single user license.

TRAINING:

GRANTS:

- 1. Highway Safety Agency Grants: OPERATION SAFE COMMUTE: This grant program continues, and assigns for one day each month an extra cruiser on the road for safe driver & enforcement patrols during specific "commuter" hours.
- 2. 1033 Defense Reutilization Program: Chief Pushee continues to scan for useful surplus equipment that would be nearby and readily accessible to obtain with limited outlay.
- 3. Highway Safety Agency "Speed" Grant 2012: This grant has been approved and we will start working these patrols next week.
- 4 Highway Safety Agency "Local DWI" Grant 2012: This grant has been approved and we will start working these patrols next week.
- 5. Highway Safety Agency "Computer System Upgrade" Grant: As above, this grant as written was denied because HSA won't fund a "replacement" of a computer system, but because we need a multi-user system, I am going to re-apply for funding to help with our second license.

JUVENILE ACTIVITY:


- We had no Diversionable Juvenile Cases in January 2012. 1.
