NEWS:

- 1. Post 612 Explorers won 2nd Place in Annual Cadet Challege Weekend Competition!!
- 2. Chief Pushee and Advisor Hargreaves sponsored the Building Search portion of Annual Cadet Competition.
- 3. We are being assisted by the NH State Police Troop B Detectives while investigating a very serious incident that occurred near the end of May.
- 4. As previously discussed, the Town seems to be victim of a rash of MV Crashes, many of which can only be defined as speed and/or alcohol-drug related issues. Theories are that reduced patrol times due to administrative loads, criminal investigations, and in a large part due to the loss of many dedicated Highway Enforcement Grant patrol hours, may all be playing a part in this year's increase.

TRAINING:

- 1. We had to cancel range training due to extreme heat/humidity for the time we had scheduled. Were not able to reschedule yet due to vacations and part time officer's schedules.
- 2. Chief Pushee and Capt. Cavanaugh were certified in Narcan Administration. Officer Bell will take this class in June.
- 3. Chief Pushee attended the annual NH Highway Safety Seminar and Training, attending a session on Teen Drivers, DUI Issues, and the Heroin Epidemic.
- 4. Officer Bell attended a three day class and was certified as a Breath Test Operator. (he had been certified many years ago, but this had lapsed)
- Capt. Cavanaugh and Officer Bell attended a Fire Dept. training session sponsored by Eversource regarding response to emergencies involving electrical concerns.

GRANTS:

- 1. FY2016 NH Highway Safety STEP Grant: We received final approvals on this grant, and are continuing to work these.
- 2. FY2016 NH Highway Safety DWI Grant: We received final approvals on this grant, and are continuing to work these.
- FY2017 STEP & DWI Grant Programs: I previously submitted my grant applications for the federal fiscal year 2017 (Oct 2016 through Sept 2017).
 Recently I was advised by NH Highway Safety that they needed me to re-submit to a lower threshold of funding. I made the requested adjustments to the patrol plans.
- 4. FY 2016-2017 OHRV Patrol Grants: We have not heard about this funding possibility yet.


