NEWS:

- PD & Cadets provided Information Booth and Public Safety Materials/Community Policing at annual "Community Cares" event held at the Elementary School.
- 2. Chief Pushee was on vacation and out of state during Thanksgiving week. Capt. Cavanaugh was assigned Officer-In-Charge.
- 3. The Department investigated and made arrests in an involved Animal Neglect/Cruelty case, with the assistance of Investigators from the Animal Rescue League of NH.
- 4. There appear to be even MORE cuts at the Police Academy due to long term funding issues, RE legislature and executive counsel who have been "raiding" the penalty assessment fund for 20 plus years for other projects outside of the purpose of said fund. There will be fewer available classes, and many classes will now be "fee based." Additionally, the Academy may have to cancel some Recruit Level Academy courses, and are discussing options for making the Basic Recruit Training Academy a fee based program as well.

TRAINING:

- Chief Pushee and Ofc. Bell were certified as LIDAR Operators on the new laser speed measurement device.
- 2. Capt. Cavanaugh and Ofc. Bell attended an impaired driver Standard Field Sobriety Testing refresher class at PSTC.
- Chief Pushee attended the Annual Law Enforcement Symposium and Training sponsored by the Primex. He received training in Liability Issues, Body Worn Camera's, Use of Force Issues and Liability, and "SWATTING" events.

GRANTS:

1. FY2016 NH Highway Safety STEP Grant: This is the Sustained Traffic Enforcement Program Grant, which consolidates the Safe Commute, the Speed, and the Traffic Signals grant programs. The Application was sent in September 20015. We are still awaiting word on the review process.
