

MONTHLY REPORT**Nov. 1st to Nov. 30th, 2014****NEWS:**

1. Cruiser Maintenance: Both cruisers have been outfitted with winter snow tires. I had been planning on purchasing both snow tires and spare steel rims for the 2014 cruiser, but due to body repair from small backing incident, decided to wait until 2015 budget to purchase these when we switch back to summer tires.
2. Officer Vaillancourt is in Field Training, and has been approved by the Academy for a "Law Package" certification. He will attempt to "test out" of some required courses as well.
3. Members of the Cadet Post helped with Traffic and Parking Control for much of the National Elections in early November.

TRAINING:

1. Officer Vaillancourt has been going through in-house classroom training in Use-of-Force, Firearms, Policies, etc. and is in Field Training.
2. Most PD Officers were available and attended the Ebola Presentation put on by Deering Residence, Dr. Eric Simon, a Biology Professor from New England College. There were also several residents at this presentation.
3. Chief Pushee taught an Expandable Baton refresher class for Ofc. Vaillancourt, Ofc. Philibert, and members of the Cadets Post.
4. Officer Parsons went through online training on PoliceOne Academy for "Narcotics Enforcement 1."
5. Capt. Cavanaugh went through online training on PoliceOne Academy for "Traffic Stops 1."
6. Chief Pushee, Ofc. Vaillancourt, and Ofc. Parsons all attended a Domestic Violence Law class at the Academy, in relation to the application of the new Domestic Violence Law.
7. Chief Pushee was recertified online with NH Police Standards to conduct the Physical Agility Testing that is required of all officers hired after 2001.
8. Chief Pushee went through online training on PoliceOne Academy, for "Emotional and Psychological Disorders."

GRANTS:

1. Highway Safety Agency Grants:
 - a. OPERATION SAFE COMMUTE 2014-2015: We are working this grant one day each month, as assigned by the NH Highway Safety Agency. This grant provides an officer specifically for traffic safety enforcement efforts during the commuter hours.
 - b. Chief Pushee has submitted applications through the NH Highway Safety Agency for Speed Enforcement, DWI Enforcement, and Traffic Signs and Signals Enforcement (stop signs). Not sure when we will hear back about these applications.

JUVENILE ACTIVITY:

1. We are investigating a Juvenile Case involving a 13 year old resident who was running away from home and stole Mom's car to do so. We have not determined yet if we will pursue as a "CHINS," a Juvenile Petition for Delinquency, or through Diversion, as there are several different aspects to this case.


