NEWS:

1. Police Cadets helped with parking/traffic at Primary Election Voting.

TRAINING:

- 1. PD trained at the range with "shooting while moving" (handgun and rifles), and with precision (targeted) shooting (handguns).
- 2. Chief Pushee attended a Seminar on Active Shooter Response at the NH Association of Chiefs of Police Trade Show.

GRANTS:

- 1. Highway Safety Agency Grants:
 - a. OPÉRATION SAFE COMMUTE: Chief Pushee has submitted reimbursement requests for \$633.xx for the 4th quarter of this grant, and final reports have been submitted.
 - b. SPEED Patrol Grant: Chief Pushee has submitted reimbursement for \$5490.xx for this grant program. This is all costs for overtime payments, including town portions of retirement, etc. Final reports have been submitted as well.
 - c. DWI Patrol Grant: Chief Pushee has submitted reimbursement for \$5015.xx for this grant program. This is all costs for overtime payments, including the town portions of retirement, etc. Final reports have been submitted as well.
- 2. Portable Radio Grant NH Department of Safety: Chief Pushee has taken receipt of a new portable radio, valued at nearly \$3300.00, from a grant program through the Department of Safety. The radio needs to be programmed, but the grant program will be reimbursing the Town for those costs as well.
- 3. 1033 Defense Reutilization Program: nothing recently on this grant, though the program is undergoing "login/sign-in" changes that are requiring some new forms and online passwords, which Chief will get to once he catches up from work accumulated during vacation.
- 4. New Highway Safety Grant: Deering has been asked to participate once again in the Operation Safe Commute Grant Program for October 2012 through September 2013. Application forms need signing tonight. This grant will cover reimbursement for overtime and related payroll costs to place an extra officer on the road for traffic safety patrols during morning and afternoon commuter periods for one day each month. This is a statewide grant program.


JUVENILE ACTIVITY:
