

MONTHLY REPORT**September 1st to 30th, 2015****NEWS:**

1. Ofc. Parsons has returned to duty, both for us Part Time, and for his full time job at HPD, after his knee injury last spring. Welcome back!
2. Ofc. Vaillancourt and his family welcomed Esme into the world!
3. Chief Pushee completed the Budget and CIP applications.

TRAINING:

1. We had to cancel monthly department training due to schedule conflicts (again).
2. Chief Pushee and Capt. Cavanaugh attended a class in dealing with Landlord & Tenant Disputes at the Police Academy.
3. Ofc. Bell completed three online classes through the Police One Academy training portal.
4. Ofc. Parsons, in his capacity at Hillsboro PD, completed highly extensive training, and is now fully certified as a Drug Recognition Expert. He will be available to conduct forensic and physical sobriety testing of person suspected of driving under the influence of drugs.

GRANTS:

1. FY 2015 NH Highway Safety Agency Grants:
 - a. OPERATION SAFE COMMUTE: These have concluded, and Chief Pushee has submitted final reports and requests for reimbursement.
 - b. SPEED ENFORCEMENT: These have concluded, and Chief Pushee has submitted final reports and requests for reimbursement.
 - c. DWI ENFORCEMENT: These have concluded, and Chief Pushee has submitted final reports and requests for reimbursement.
 - d. TRAFFIC SIGN/SIGNALS: These have concluded, and Chief Pushee has submitted final reports and requests for reimbursement.
2. FY2016 NH Highway Safety STEP Grant: This is the Sustained Traffic Enforcement Program Grant, which consolidates the Safe Commute, the Speed, and the Traffic Signals grant programs. Chief Pushee has submitted applications for Tier 2 Funding. If approved in full, this grant will provide nearly \$12K in reimbursement for overtime salary and related employment expenses. If approved, these patrols will begin in January 2016.
3. FY2016 NH Highway Safety DWI Grant: Chief Pushee has submitted applications for Tier 2 Funding. If approved in full, this grant will provide nearly \$6K in reimbursement for overtime salary and related employment expenses. If approved, these patrols will begin in January 2016.
4. Bulletproof Vest Program: Chief Pushee has received all of the vests ordered on this program, and they have been issued. We have received the invoice, and Chief Pushee will be submitting this, and then working on the online reimbursement requests.

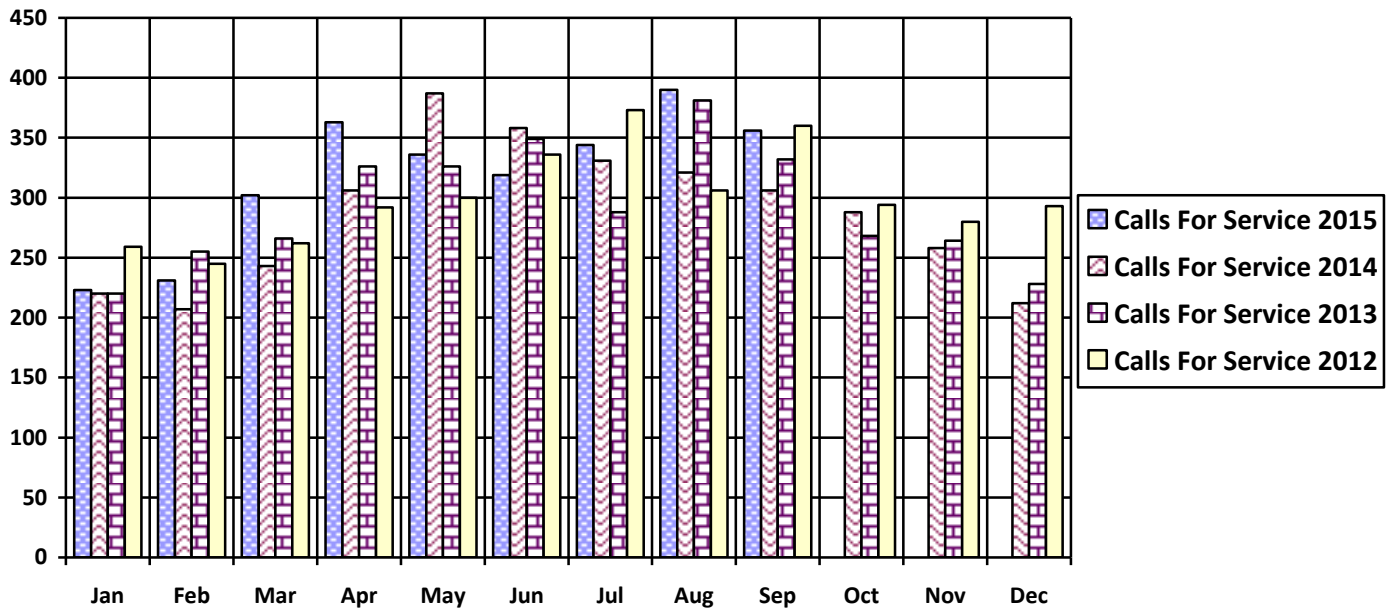
